When including siblings, this allowed 161 children to access the online learning using these devices. On average, 18 out of 21 classes showed increased attendance from the beginning to the end of the January 2021 lockdown. Children from Y1-6 had access to a teacher or TA for the entire school day via the 'open zoom call' and to encourage engagement. Pupils with EHCPs settled back into school post lockdown with minimal disruption or distress as relationships had been maintained with their significant adults during the lockdown period.
