FOUNDATION

Next term, we will be thinking about animals that live on a farm. We will kick start our learning with the story of the Three Little Pigs. We will learn about the different building materials, with our own building yard in the garden and find out which ones are the strongest. We will also be learning about the signs of spring and what changes we can see. We will enjoy a walk to the park and take photos of the new life all around us!

We will end the short term talking about what Christians believe about the festival of Easter and hope to have an Easter egg hunt and share some tasty treats.

YEAR1

In English, we are going to be working on a book called Astro Girl by Ken Wilson-Max. It is about a little girl called Astrid, who loves space and wants to be an astronaut! She has lots of fun with her Papa, finding out what it takes to become one: from doing experiments and eating dried food, to getting used to nearzero gravity. She really wants to meet her personal hero and real-life astronaut soon! In Maths, we are

going to be working on numbers to 40, comparing these using our knowledge of tens and ones. We are going to revisit addition and subtraction strategies and use these to help solve word problems. We are also going to practice counting in tens and fives and this would be a good things to practice over the holidays.

In our topic Moon Zoom, we are going to be thinking about space and learning about the first moon landing by astronaut Neil Armstrong. We will also be looking at the art work Starry Night by Vincent Van Gough. It would be nice to spend some time together, looking up at the stars and talking about what you can see over the half term holiday:)

YEAR 2

In English, we are going to be continuing our learning based around bears. Our writing story is The Bear under the Stairs by Helen Cooper. We will be learning how to retell the story in our own words and learn and share details about our own fears! In Maths, we will be starting our journey into fractions. This will mean that by the end of next half term we will have done +,-,x,÷ AND fractions. At this point we will have totally covered our arithmetic papers. Please continue to practise your times tables at home. Times tables fluency is essential to our maths learning throughout our school journey. Please use the cards we have sent home to help with this.

Our next topic learning is focused on The Great Fire of London. Please take time over the holidays to do some research about London, past and present, looking at the famous landmarks and how it has changed since the Great Fire of London in 1666. Please also do lots of shared reading and take time to have lots of fun with family and friends. We can't wait to see you again in the Spring term! Stay safe and happy during the February half term.

YEAR3

In English next term, we will be reading the wonderful text;

Africa – Amazing Africa In Maths, we will be focusing on measuring and comparing length in metres and centimetres. We will also be working on our skills with the weighing scales and measuring volume in millilitres and litres.

Our ILP next term is Tribal Tales and we will be learning all about the Stone Age. We challenge you all to find 10 facts about the Stone Age to share in class after the half term holiday. In ICT, our focus will be Internet safety and the importance of being safe online. There are lots of useful tools and support for families on the internetmatters.org website, please go online and take a look.

In Science, we are studying magnets and how they work. Please find five facts to share about magnets after the half term holiday too. You could take a trip to the Silk Mill Museum in Derby or, if you fancy an adventure, why not hop on the train to Think Tank Science Museum in Birmingham or Magna Science Adventure Centre in Rotherham! We hope you have a lovely holiday from the Year 3 team.

YEAR4

Next term in English, we are looking at The Lion and the Unicorn by Shirley Hughes. Children will explore the text in its historical context and discuss the themes and imagery within. They will also explore a range of grammatical concepts including dialogue to create inference about a character, a variety of noun phrases to create description, character comparisons using conjunctions, personification and prepositions to describe a setting. They will write a range of diary entries, letters, character comparisons, setting descriptions and finish by writing their own evacuation narrative.

In Maths, we are learning graphs, including how to draw bar and line graphs as well as being able to answer questions by interpreting the data. We are continuing our learning of the times tables to improve our fluency.

We would recommend the children practising their violin, noticing how the strings make a vibration which creates a sound. Please also go for a walk in the half term and listen for any bird songs as the weather is starting to get warmer an continue to practise your times tables as well as reading everyday.

YEAR5

In English, children will continue to read The Lost Happy **Endings** by Carol Ann Duffy, which is a narrative themed around dreams, fate and fortune. Children will be practising skills around writing poetry, letters, diary entries and how to construct direct speech in writing. Children will then move on to reading Freedom Bird by Jerdine Nolan, which is themed around belonging and equality. Children will be practising their biography writing skills.

In Maths, children will be looking at Decimals (including reading and writing decimals as a fraction, ordering and comparing decimals), Percentages (including writing percentages as a fraction and a decimal), and Geometry (including estimating and comparing angles, and drawing and measuring angles in degrees).

In their next topic Beast and Biomes we will be looking at minibeasts. During the holidays please visit the local park or go out in the garden and keep your eyes peeled for all kinds of mini-beasts and the types of habitats they are living in. YEAR6

In our writing lessons next term, we will be delving into a fascinating text Suffragette: The Battle for Equality by David Roberts. Through this text we will be continuing to develop our formal letter writing skills and learning to write a balanced argument. In reading, we will be studying Malala: My story of standing up for girls' rights by Malala Yousafzai with Patricia McCormick. This text is an illustrated adaptation for young readers of the bestselling memoir, I am Malala.

During Maths next term, Year 6 will be tackling some new concepts as we will be learning all about ratio and algebra. Please keep practising on TT Rock Stars - this always helps!

In order to prepare for next term, children should find out about World War Two. We will be focusing on children's experiences during this time in our history. Encourage children to research this topic by looking online. BBC KS2 History; World War Two, is a good website. You could also find books in the local library or visit a museum such as the Imperial War Museum in Manchester! Have a great week off! From the Year 6 Team!
